If you add the ages of each descendant of Peleg through Isaac at the they had their children you see it was 351 years from the abandonment of the tower of Babel until the birth of Esau and Jacob. Add the age of earth at the time of Peleg's birth, and you can see the earth was approximately 2,009 years old.

According to Genesis 47:9, Jacob was 130 years old when he and his family moved to Egypt. Exodus 12:40 tells us the family of Israel sojourned in Egypt 430 years. Add this to the age of earth at Jacob's birth, and we find the earth was about 2,569 years old when the Hebrews left Egypt.
